In his opening remarks the review committee's chairperson and the Deputy Director of Academic Affairs at KEWI Mr. Eric Wamiti, emphasized the crucial function of the review procedure.

The academic policies under review were the examination, student welfare, and the student's rules and regulations policies.

While emphasizing that the academic policy review exercise attempts to make sure that the institution's current and developing academic demands are addressed, Mr Wamiti noted that the institution is bound to respond to the needs of its stakeholders in order to realize its vision and fulfill its mission as it develops and grows.

"We value the efforts made by the institute to recognize the importance of this procedure. The modification will support the organization in its ongoing pursuit of efficiency and excellence in the academic discipline as a whole, which is one of the main tenets of the KEWI mandate.

This is because the academic discipline is constantly changing." He said.

Dr. James Kiprop Chelang'a (PhD), a Senior Lecturer at Moi University Department of History, Political Science, and Public Administration, guided the committee in drafting suggestions and administrative directives intended to carry out the goals of the policy within a framework to implement procedures.

He commended the institute for taking the initiative to make sure that it fulfills its current and future academic demands as it expands, develops, and responds to the needs of its stakeholders in attaining its vision and completing its purpose.

Concurrently, a workshop on the development of productivity metrics has come to a conclusion, having commenced on Tuesday, October 3rd, 2023.

The National Productivity and Competitiveness Centre (NPCC) in the State Department for Labor and Skills Development, Ministry of Labor, and Social Protection program on productivity management across all Ministries, Departments, and Agencies (MDAs) in the country is underway.

This marks the beginning of the implementation of the first activity in the productivity

mainstreaming program in the public service, which is one of the performance targets set for all MDAs in the 20th cycle of public sector performance contracting for 2023–24 FY.

The nomination and sensitization of the productivity management committee on productivity are essential to achieving the goal of productivity mainstreaming. NPCC's assistance facilitated the building of the metrics for measuring productivity, gathering the appropriate data for measurement, calculating a productivity index for KEWI, and, finally, creating

and putting into practice a strategy for productivity enhancement.

Dr. Nahashon Moitalel Langat, the secretary of productivity at the National Productivity and Competitiveness Centre (NPCC), gave a brief background on the institution.

He stated that Kenya aspires to achieve globally competitive middle-income country status, offering a high quality of life, by the year 2030.

The attainment of this aspiration is hinged on the country's ability to achieve rapid and sustainable economic and productivity growth.

“We must embrace continuous improvement as a key strategy for gaining competitive advantage to attain the transformation envisaged in the Kenya Vision 2030 and the Kenya Constitution 2010.” He emphasized.
